What is Welsh Heritage Week? An annual one-week course in Welsh language, traditional hymn singing, folk music, folk dance, and good fun!

Who comes to WHW? People of all ages from all over North America. Participants include children, teens, young adults, families, singles, parents, grandparents -- everyone who wants to have a good time learning about Welsh culture.

Who sponsors WHW? The Welsh Harp & Heritage Society of North America, Inc. was established to promote Welsh culture through Wales' national instrument, the harp, and its associated traditions. The tradition of the harp in Wales directly relates to many other Welsh traditions including singing, folk dancing, poetry, and, ultimately, the language itself.

Classes? Welsh Language and Literature, Music, Folk Dance, a variety of classes are offered at Welsh Heritage Week. You choose what you want to take. Lots of fun, no pressure. Classes meet Monday – Saturday.

Staff? All are native Welsh speakers who teach in our language classes, as well as teaching their specialties.

Any other activities? Entertainment is planned for each evening of the course, although these events, like the classes, are optional. There's a pub night, a traditional Noson Lawen, staff concert, barn dance or Welsh equivalent of a ceilidh, Eisteddford bardic ceremony and Sunday hymn singing to cap off a week of practice in Ysgol Gan (singing school).
